But it wasn't until she plunked herself down beside Stella in the lunchroom that she really took in the gravity of the situation. Stella looked at her with bloodshot eyes and opened up about her son's recent diagnosis. And, though Adair didn't have any wise words for her in that moment, the empathy she showed as she held Stella's hand and listened spoke grace to her friend.

God has made us for community, and he has placed us alongside people who need true friendships. His Spirit in us can give us the discernment to notice when people are hurting and need a listening ear and the courage to offer ourselves. And sometimes our empathy is the most generous gift we can offer. Who are the people in your life you can listen to today?
