"The Wesleyan Church is once again standing in the gap to serve those in crisis," Wilson said. "Prayer is always needed as we seek to serve as we are able. This is an opportunity for our denomination to be the hands and feet of Christ. May God bless our service."

"Every morning, I pray for The Wesleyan Church, that we will have a transforming presence in every ZIP code," Schmidt said. "Thank you for being a people of God who bring hope and peace to your local communities, but also to communities throughout the world in times of crisis, like those most recently in Freetown, Sierre Leone, Charlottesville, Virginia, and the Gulf Coast of Texas.

"We are united in prayer and common purpose," said Schmidt. "I urge you to continue to pray for crisis victims and for those who serve them."
